trusses are here.



The **Camden Catacombs** are a system of underground passages in <u>Camden Town</u> in north London underneath part of the <u>Camden markets</u>, constructed in the 19th century, and as of 2012 owned by <u>Network Rail</u>. They are not true <u>catacombs</u> as they were never used as repositories for dead bodies, instead being an underground area originally used as stables for horses and pit ponies working on the railways. The catacombs also included an underground pool for canal boats operating on the nearby <u>Regent's Canal</u>. They are not

open to visitors owing to danger of flooding.

Welsh rarebit muffins.

Ingredients

50g plain flour, 225g self-raising flour, 1 tsp <u>baking powder, ½</u> level tsp <u>bicarbonate of soda,</u> ¼ tsp salt, ½ level tsp mustard powder, 100g strong cheese Caerphilly is best but Wensleydale will do, half grated, half cubed, 6 tbsp vegetable oil, 150g Greek yogurt, 125ml <u>milk,</u> 1 large free range <u>egg,</u> 1 tbsp Worcestershire sauce.

Method

- 1. Heat oven to 200C/fan 180C/gas 6.
- 2. Mix together the self-raising and plain flour, baking powder, bicarbonate of soda, salt and mustard powder in a bowl.
- 3. In a separate bowl, mix the cheese, oil, yogurt, milk, egg and Worcestershire sauce.
- 4. Combine all the ingredients and divide between the muffin cases in the muffin tin.
- 5. Place in the oven for 20-25 mins until golden. Remove and cool slightly on a rack.
- 6. What you will need: Ask the kids to help? get everything ready, weighing scales, measuring jug, fork, 2 mixing bowls, 12 paper muffin cases, muffin tin, cheese grater, sharp knife, tablespoon, cooling rack. And off you go!
